As you know, the Midwifery Act has made regulated and publicly funded midwifery in Saskatchewan. Midwives currently practice in the Saskatoon, Regina-Qu'Appelle and Cypress Health Regions. Unfortunately, none of these sites are in the Health Region where I live.

Midwives offer excellent maternity care and I was delighted to learn that their services are now legal and funded in Saskatchewan. Imagine my disappointment when I realized that, while midwifery care would be available to a lucky few, I was not among them.

These paragraphs say what you want your representative to do for you.

I am asking you to urge the government to publicly commit to a timeframe within which I can expect midwifery services to be available to my family. I would like to see the government offer incentives to the health regions who have not yet integrated midwives into their maternity service and work with them to speed this process of making midwives available to childbearing women across the province.
